School Travel Plans

Rolleston Christian School and Selwyn District Council are working together to improve road safety and reduce congestion at pick up and drop off times.

Our school travel plan aims to support and encourage children to travel to and from school by means other than driving whenever possible. This plan considers local road safety issues which may be affecting the choices whanau make on how their children travel to and from school.

Travel

When leaving the car park left turn only out on to Springston Rolleston Road.

Parents can now park in the church car park and also the car parks at the back alongside Foster Park.

Kiss N' Go

When using the kiss n'go, remember to keep the gaps filled.

If a car moves out, slowly move forward so vehicles can come in behind you. This area is a 2-minute maximum wait time, please do not leave your vehicle.



School wheel rules

We encourage all school tamariki to use an active mode for their journey to and from school. For them to be safe on their chosen mode, all users have to wear a helmet, this includes:



Cycling
this is a legal requirement.



Scotering
(especially on electric scooters).

Crossing the road with wheels

For students to be safe out in the road, we ask for them to walk their bikes and scooters across any crossing points. Remind them to stop, look, listen, and look again.

Walking

We encourage all students from new entrants to year 3 to wear a high-vis vest walking to and from school.



Vehicles

We encourage an active mode of travel for our students, but we know that this is not always possible. If you are planning on using a car for the school journey.

Avoid u-turns anywhere near the school access points, especially near the kea crossing/road patrol.

If parking out on the street, please get passengers to get in and out of cars on the footpath side.

Parking

We know parking can be difficult around the school. Parents can now park in the church car park and also the car parks at the back alongside Foster Park.



When leaving the car park, please turn left only. This elevates the queuing traffic in the car park.
